Meeting Minutes: May 8, 2021

Wordwrights met on May 8, 2021, at the Last Drop Coffee Shop in Oklahoma City, from 10:00 a.m. until noon. Barbara Zimmerman presided and opened with prayer.

Zimmerman reminded those in attendance that Wordwrights needs to replace the Treasurer position. Victor Driver agreed to take the Secretary position beginning in June.

Brags included Barbara Zimmerman reporting that she has scheduled presentations to students through the help of an elementary-school librarian. Margaret Brown shared that she has sold over 2,000 copies of her children's book.

Shelley Stutchman gave the devotional/prayer based on her experience as a test subject for the COVID-19 vaccine.

It was brought to the attention of the group that member Virginia Hoppes was extremely ill and had left Epworth Villa and was living in Tulsa near family. (After our meeting, Barbara Zimmerman reached out to the family and learned that Virginia went to be with our Lord on Mother's Day, at the age of 97.)

During Business, Victor Driver presented research on updating our website. Plans include two to three officers also having access to the management of the website. He plans to work on a website to show at the June meeting for a vote.
