Meeting Minutes: April 10, 2021

Wordwrights met on April 10, 2021 at the Last Drop Coffee Shop in Oklahoma City, from 10:00 a.m. until 12:10 p.m. Barbara Zimmerman presided.

Zimmerman welcomed the group and reminded those in attendance that Wordwrights needs to replace the Secretary and Treasurer positions. Victor Driver expressed interest in filling the Secretary position and will consider the matter.

Brags included Barbara Zimmerman reporting that she became a vendor with Edmond Public Schools, which resulted in sales of her newly published book, *Mosie Lou and the Teacher.* She has made contact with several librarians, which has also led to sales. Dana Tramba reported that her article, "God's Grace is Sufficient," was published by Breakthrough Intercessor Prayer Magazine, which is available online at intercessors.org.

Ricky Briody provided the Devotional/Prayer, which was read by Donna Le. The devotional was based on John 3:8 and included a poem.

Barbara Zimmerman presented "Ordinary People Doing Extraordinary Things" taken from a prayer app (Give Him 15) by Dutch Sheets. The author mentioned that Jamie Buckingham told the story.

During Business, a discussion was held about the presence of Wordwrights on the internet. Dana Tramba made a motion that Victor Driver investigate updating the Wordwrighs website and presence on the internet. Jean Reed seconded the motion. Discussion was held, a vote was taken, and the motion carried. The intent is that since Victor Driver has built websites and has the knowledge and tools to investigate current online needs of Wordwrights, he would research the matter, talk with our web master Barbara Shepherd, and present a proposal to the group.

Donna Le led the program, "Show, Tell—and Ask." Members shared projects and requested information they needed to help complete their work. Wordwrights members spent time discussing their various projects and/or needs, including those indicated below:

*Victor Driver expressed that Christian writers would be in great demand in the near future, so we should prepare ourselves for coming opportunities.

*Dana Tramba shared that she leads a writing group every Monday morning at Touchmark (Edmond). Tramba has a website (dandystories.com) where she blogs her Christian-based stories. Tramba is working on an autobiography which will highlight struggles she's experienced in her life. Tramba is looking for markets for some of her stories. The group recommended she follow-up with two of our members (Lori Williams and Louise Tucker Jones) who might have some information and sources to help her.

*Donna Le renewed her desire to create a regular blog on her website.

*Barbara Zimmerman announced she had written at least seventy poems based on nature that she thought might be good for an audience seeking peace. Zimmerman wondered how she might turn those poems into a book. The group gave her suggestions.

Donna Le distributed a handout on the writing process and briefly discussed writing prompts.

Victor Driver agreed to be the speaker at the May meeting.

Barbara Zimmerman gave a closing prayer. Attendees included: Dana Tramba, Victor Driver, Donna Le, Jean Reed, Darla Hunter, Barbara Zimmerman, and the Staff of Last Drop Coffee Shop.

It may have begun In those wooden pews at church, The hymnal open before me As we sang the alto part together. Later, I learned that many Of the notes we sang Weren't in print as yet.


They began early, But have continued through the years, Lessons of harmony.
